DIRECTORS' REPORT TO THE SHAREHOLDERS

Dear Shareholders,

The Directors of your Company are pleased to place before you the performance for Q1 ended September 30, 2013 along with the unaudited interim condensed financial statements.

The business in the quarter under review has been challenging for the company. Post National Elections in May 2013 there was a great sense of optimism in the country in respect of improved business scenario as the country had witnessed dismal economic growth in the earlier years, however these positive vibes have yet to transform into creating a business environment which can take the country into achieving higher GDP growth in the future years which is strategically important for Pakistan.

The quarter under review witnessed spiral PKR devaluation against the foreign currencies along with massive increases in the power tariff and other energy inputs. These are expected to have adverse impact on the inflation in the country in the financial year 13/14. Thal Limited will be directly impacted with these cost push factors and its partial impact of increase in the cost of operations has already come in the first quarter.

Company Operations:

The sales revenue for the first quarter of the financial year 13/14 at Rs 2.630 billion was lower than Rs 2.903 billion in the corresponding quarter last year and consequently Profit after tax for the first quarter under review was down to Rs 203 million as compared to Rs 351 million in the corresponding quarter last year.

Engineering Segment

The Auto industry in the country witnessed modest growth in the volumes during this quarter however this growth was lower than the general market expectations because of sluggish economic activities in the country, the reasons which we have dealt in the earlier paragraphs and the lower base numbers of the corresponding quarter. This business segment of the Company however witnessed reduced volumes compared to corresponding quarter as its key OEM customer's market share in the auto sector showed a downward trend and this resulted in reduced revenue for the first quarter under review which was Rs.1.528 billion Compared to Rs 1.690 billion in the corresponding quarter last year, a decline of 10%.

However, aftermarket sales of thermal division though a small component in this business segment presently showed healthy increases as compared to last year due to inclusion of the new products and increase focus on service through process efficiencies and effective cost controls.

The company continues to make concerted efforts on improving the quality and creating cost efficiencies through cost cutting, material resourcing, training & development, along with the constant focus on exploring new business opportunities and these activities have been recognized by the Original Equipment Manufacturer (OEM) regularly in their evaluation of various KPI's relating to quality and deliveries.

Your company is also expecting that the second quarter of the financial year 13/14 will equally be challenging in terms of sales volumes because of the sluggish business scenario in the country, impeding model changes by OEM and also of traditional new year registration where the customers defer their purchases of the cars till the advent of the New Year. This is expected to have adverse impact on the profitability the company in shape of lower sales revenue, lower capacity utilization and higher inventories. The company will be making all-out effort to mitigate this impact by exploring new business opportunities from other OEM.

The government recently announced issuing the Auto Industry Policy for comments by stake holders and we expect that the government will provide level playing field to the local auto industry entire supply chain which will have positive impact on the overall economy in the country.

Building Material & Allied Products Segment

The sale revenue of the Building Material & Allied Products Segment for the first quarter of financial year 13/14 amounted to Rs 1.102 billion from Rs 1.212 billion in the corresponding quarter which reflects a reduction of 9%.

Jute Operations:

The export business was challenging due to the political crisis in the major exports market and currency depreciation in India one of our competitor with the results that the exports during the quarter were lower in addition to this the bottom line of the business was also affected by substantial increases in power tariff, rise in wages cost during the period which could not be passed on fully.

This sector is to a large extent dependent on the global factors as the raw materials is imported and the exports sales constitutes a sizeable part of its top line, however the business is focused to enhance its share in international markets by producing & exporting environment friendly jute goods and in this regard we have recently got compliance report from accredited Independent Consultant for Vegetable Oil Treated (VOT). This is expected to support our business in newer markets. The demand in local market though under pressure is expected to improve in coming months with sizeable demand of grain sacks.

Papersack Operations:

Paperback business witnessed a decline in order quantities from the cement sector, as the cement units exhausted their stocks in hand to comply with the requirements of printing of selling prices on bags in this year Federal budget, however by the end of quarter under review order positions have normalized to a large extent.

The Papersack business continued to concentrate on export markets, however, devaluation of currency in India has hampered our efforts to penetrate the market in the short term. The business continued to export papersacks to its other regional customers, and future orders from these markets are already in the pipeline.

The Self Operating Satchel (SOS) business is also expected to gain momentum, as the business has initiated the process for ISO 22000 Certification. Additionally, the expected expansion in existing global fast food franchises and arrival of new chains in Pakistan will create the demand for quality packaging materials, which the business is geared to provide.

Laminate Operations:

In the quarter under review the Laminates business maintained its positive momentum in terms of sales revenue, with concentration on exports and corporate customers, which enabled the business to partially mitigate the rising cost of inputs in the short term. In the longer term, the continuing devaluation of the Pak Rupee and rising cost of energy will strain the profitability of the business and can have an adverse impact on the bottom line. The situation will be further compounded by the fact that most of the competing units operate in the unorganized / undocumented sector.

We are pleased to share that Laminates Business has also been nominated as the Logistical Distributor for DuPont's Corian® & Montelli® range of solid surfaces. The management is confident that this product will further complement the FORMITE product line and expand the reach of the business.

Makro-Habib Pakistan Limited (MHPL)

MHPL continued its Cash and Carry business on the Saddar store. The operation of this store is handled by METRO Habib Cash and Carry Pakistan under the terms of the Operation Agreement. The Company's holding is 100%. The store is subject to a legal case pending adjudication in the Supreme Court of Pakistan.

Habib- Metro Pakistan (Private) Limited (HMPL)

HMPL own and manage properties. Our holding is 60 %. We are pleased to report that HMPL has declared 1st interim dividend for the quarter ended September 30, 2013 and our Company share of Rs 54.686 million will be incorporated in the next quarter financials.

SELECTED EXPLANATORY NOTES TO THE CONDENSED INTERIM FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE PERIOD ENDED SEPTEMBER 30, 2013 (Un-audited)

1 THE COMPANY AND ITS OPERATIONS

1.1 Thal Limited (the Company) was incorporated on January 31, 1966 as a public company limited by shares under the Companies Act, 1913 (now the Companies Ordinance, 1984) and is listed on the Karachi and Lahore Stock Exchanges.

The Company is engaged in the manufacture of jute goods, engineering goods, papersack and laminate sheets. The Jute operation is at Muzaffargarh, engineering operation at Karachi, papersack operation at Hub and Gadoon and laminate operation located at Hub. The registered office of the Company is situated at 4th Floor, House of Habib, 3 Jinnah Co-operative Housing Society, Block 7/8, Sharae Faisal, Karachi.

1.2 These condensed interim financial statements are separate financial statements of the Company in which investments in subsidiaries and associates are accounted for on the basis of direct equity interest and are not consolidated or accounted for using equity method.

2 BASIS OF PREPARATION

- 2.1 These condensed interim financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the International Accounting Standard (IAS) 34, "Interim Financial Reporting" and provisions of and directives issued under the Companies Ordinance, 1984. In case where requirements differ, the provisions of or directives issued under the Companies Ordinance, 1984 have been followed.
- 2.2 These condensed interim financial statements do not include all the information and disclosure required in the annual financial statements, and should be read in conjunction with the Company's annual financial statements for the year ended June 30, 2013.

3 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these condensed interim financial statements are consistent with those followed in the preparation of the Company's annual financial statements for the year ended June 30, 2013.

1 THE HOLDING COMPANY AND ITS OPERATIONS

Thal Limited (the holding Company) was incorporated on January 31, 1966 as a public company limited by shares under the Companies Act, 1913 (now the Companies Ordinance, 1984) and is listed on the Karachi and Lahore Stock Exchanges.

The holding company is engaged in the manufacture of jute goods, engineering goods, papersacks and laminate sheets. The registered office of the holding company is situated at 4th Floor, House of Habib, 3 Jinnah Co-operative Housing Society, Block 7/8, Sharae Faisal, Karachi.

The Group comprises of the holding company and its subsidiaries, Noble Computer Services (Private) Limited, Pakistan Industrial Aids (Private) Limited, Makro-Habib Pakistan Limited, A-One Enterprises (Pvt) Limited, Habib Metro Pakistan (Pvt) Ltd and Thal Boshoku Pakistan (Private) Limited.

Noble Computer Services (Private) Limited is engaged in providing share registrar and related accounting services, share floatation services, data entry services and internal audit services.

Pakistan Industrial Aids (Private) Limited is engaged in trading of various products.

Makro-Habib Pakistan Limited is engaged in a chain of wholesale / retail cash and carry stores.

A-One Enterprises (Pvt) Limited owns a land at Multan road, Lahore.

Habib Metro Pakistan (Pvt) Limited, main business is to own and manage properties.

Thal Boshoku Pakistan (Private) Limited has not yet commenced its operations.

These subsidiaries have been consolidated in these interim condensed consolidated financial statements.

2 BASIS OF PREPERATION

These condensed interim consolidated financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the International Accounting Standard (IAS) - 34, "Interim Financial Reporting" and provisions of and directives issued under the Companies Ordinance, 1984. In case where requirements differ, the provisions of or directives issued under the Companies Ordinance, 1984 have been followed.

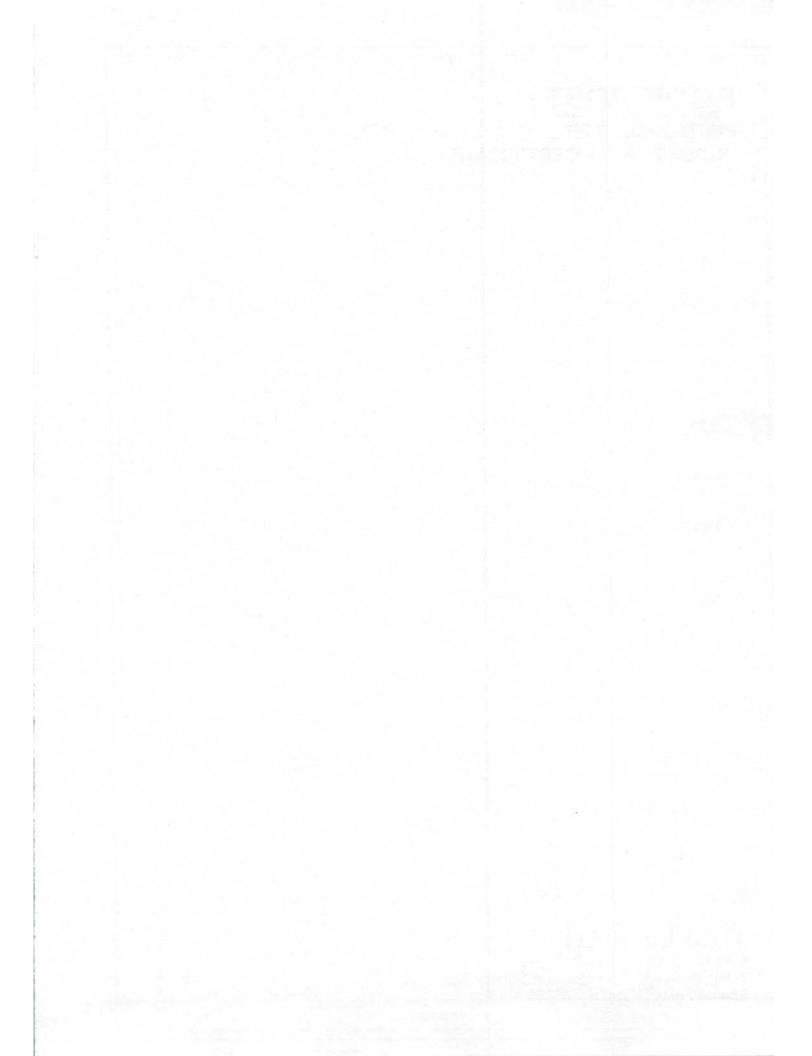
